Priority:	Reducing drug misuse use
Healthier Behaviour Outcomes:	<ol> <li>To increase the number of children who feel that they have a good knowledge about medicines, tobacco, alcohol and other drugs</li> <li>To increase the number of children who feel able to make safe choices around drugs (including medicines, tobacco and alcohol).</li> </ol>
Activities:	Needs assessment:  Audit whole school provision for addressing drug related issues  Identify staff & curriculum needs and plan to address, with support from PDE Team.  Planning & preparation:  Cluster staff training session/s  Learning about good practice, current evidence base.  Drug education resource workshop using a variety of resources:  E.g. storybooks, scenario boards, puppets, medicine packets etc.  Review and develop school drug policies  Communicate HS+ planned activities to wider school community (parents, pupils, staff and governors etc)  Purchase new drug education resources  Enhance elements of drug education within PSHE  Plan opportunities for family learning  Implementation:  Enhance elements of drug education within PSHE  Use of new resources  Interactive lessons addressing a range of learning styles  Incorporating assessment for learning  Updating school drug policy  Parents evening to promote family learning  E.g. You may be able to link this with an LEC visit & related support e.g. teacher activity folder for pre & post follow up work  Teachers deliver module of work, including use of LEC resources
